


New Business – Nothing was offered this evening.

Pulling a Model T out of the Mud

An owner of a Model T Ford had a novel idea for extricating his car from bad mud holes. He raises the hood and passes one end of a rope through the floor boards, tying it to the clutch pedal. The brake lever should be placed in the neutral position during this operation. The engine throttle is opened up. The driver walks to the loose end of the rope, throws it over his shoulder and pulls. This pulls the clutch to activate the low band applying power to the rear wheels, which together with the force of his pull and the lessened weight in the car, suffices to pull the car out in most cases. As soon as the car is out he loosens his pull on the rope allowing the clutch to return to neutral. Taken from Popular Mechanics, 1922.

Editor's Note: You better be quick to release the rope or you might just get run over!
