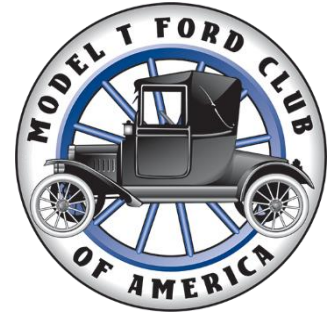

Bamber Memorial Tour – August 20

Fun Tour to the Monte Vista Inn Honoring George, Betty and Bill Bamber

This year the tour was centered in Middletown, California which is south of Clearlake, Ca in Lake County.

First day was the most challenging. The trip was 95 miles. Taking very steep and winding roads, we traveled to the outskirts of Calistoga and visited a Petrified Forest. You could walk the .5 trail and see ash flows (which looked like cement) and where the original owner of the land, Petrified Pete, had dug into the earth and exposed petrified logs. We all left the Petrified Forest to have lunch on your own at St Helena. Then it was on to a very challenging and very steep road to get back to

Model T Parts – Backorders

Some reproduction Model T parts are beginning to be hard to find. One of these parts, copper head gaskets, are not available at this time. Apparently, the die used to make the gasket has worn out and resulted in a batch of bad gaskets. So, manufacturing has stopped. We hear from the MTFCA Forum that a new die is being made but it will be several months before gaskets are available. The cost of the new gasket may be much higher since they have to recoup the cost of the die in the final sales price. So, if you are anticipating work on your T that would require a new head gasket, ask around before tearing it down. Possibly a member has an extra they would sell. It may be possible to reuse if you are careful removing.

Many of these parts are manufactured by individuals as a side business and in their home shop. Many of these individuals are “aging out”, a term we hear a lot. The owner tries to sell the business or if no takers, just shuts it down. The [MTFCA Forum](#) is a good place to ask and keep abreast of repair and replacement techniques and parts issues. And always call the parts vendor to verify availability. Don't totally rely on the parts catalog. I have seen the gaskets on Ebay for up to \$200, Yikes!
