Presidents Message



Hi everyone,

The fall colors and weather are rolling in and I'm happy to welcome the change to a new season.

We had a great General Meeting last month with lots of member participation and business matters taken care of. The membership voted and approved a total of \$3,650 in 2025 charitable donations to other charitable organizations. The breakdown is as follows: \$1,000 to the Placer Assistance League, \$500 to the MTFCA Museum, \$500 to the Piquette Museum, \$150 for our CAM Membership, \$500 to sponsor the 1914 T at CAM and \$1,000 for a CAM donation. A question was asked about our ability to donate to charitable organizations that are not Model T related. According to the rules of

our IRS nontaxable charitable club rules, which is a 501C (7), we are to donate our charitable funds to 501C (3) charitable organizations such as museums, feed the hungry, medical research such as heart or lung associations, etc. We are not limited to donations only to Model T organizations.

Secondly, the membership voted and approved an increase in Member Dues from \$20 to \$30 per year beginning in 2026. Our club's dues have never been raised since January, 2001. This topic was first brought to the membership towards the beginning of this year and, at that time, members were in favor of the increase. Please see the minutes of the September Meeting in this newsletter for more information about the above topics, as well as other points of business discussed.

We all had a great time at Elaine and Vern Marriott's BBQ at Elaine's ranch on the 20th. We can always expect great food and conversation at this event. Elaine goes all out to make this such a great time. Thanks, Elaine, for hosting us again this year!

A Little History The Piquette Plant Museum

While discussing our club donations at the last meeting there were questions about the Piquette Plant Museum. The Piquette is known as the birth place of the Model T Ford. It was the Ford Motor Company's first purpose-built factory. Previously space was rented on Mack Ave. Ford Models B, C, F, K, N, R, S, and the first 12,000 Model Ts were assembled here and shipped out by railroad. Ford Motor Company relocated to its new Highland Park Plant in 1910, selling the Piquette building to Studebaker in 1911. This is a different museum from the MTFCA Model T Museum in Richmond, Indiana. You can read more about the Piquette Plant by clicking on the link on our club home page.

What's Happening at the CAM

The present main exhibit celebrates one of the most iconic pieces of American automotive history, the Ford Mustang! "We have a comprehensive history of the Mustang, from when it first hit the roads in 1965 to the current era of Mustangs. In addition, we will have interactive experiences and digital displays showcasing the iconic image of the Ford Mustang in American media over the decades."


Old Cemetery Tour - Murder, Mayhem & Mystery Sunday, October 5, 2025

What ever happened to Leno's Law

"Leno's Law," officially Senate Bill 712, was a California bill that sought to exempt classic cars from California smog inspection requirements. Named after car enthusiast Jay Leno, the bill aimed to promote the state's car culture but was ultimately rejected by lawmakers in late August. In the latest Crusin' News, Sam Toll gave the details on its demise. As the bill moved through several subcommunities it was morphed, changed, and became weaker. By the time they were through debating and changing it would have only covered vehicles made prior to 1981. (current law is from 1976). The bill would have required all cars to have collector car insurance and historic plates. Many owners prefer the Year of Manufacture (YOM) plate because it makes the car look more authentic. Both the insurance and plate requirement would have put restrictions on when you could drive the car. So, it ended up in the Assembly Appropriations Committee's suspense bin.
