Member Steve Elliott has been working all Summer and Fall to get his 1925 TT on the road. It is finally done and is a very beautiful TT. Steve is also




working with Ben Hardeman of *Texas T Parts* on a disc brake prototype for the TT.

Embroidered logo patches both large and small are also available. These can be sewn onto jackets or other items of your choosing. Contact Kitty for these items.




#### Disc brakes for your TT

#### Fourth of a short series on "The Prodigal Ford" or "Lizzy, Come Home"

By 1963, I had married, bought a house in North Hollywood and soon had the pickup running. The engine in the truck was not usable without re-boring, so I replaced it with one that was a runner. I just adjusted the bearings, hand lapped the valves and put it in the truck. I was soon using it to commute the 12 miles to work. It is generally assumed that the San Fernando valley is flat. If you drive a worn out T from East to West you will find out that it isn't so. The thing will begin to labor as you approach Fulton Ave. I used to complain about having to climb the Fulton grade to get to work

Between 1963 and 1968, we had many good times with the truck. I continued to drive it to work and participate in club tours and other functions. Mary Lynn and I along with our friends Fred and Sara made several two and three day trips to various places in Southern California. We had no other car or backup of any kind, just tools and spare parts. I recall that on one occasion we went to the trolley museum in Perris, about 100 miles from home. I had forgotten to bring a file so, when a rod needed adjusting, I rubbed the rod cap on a hollow stone block to grind it down enough to fit.

During these years, my friend Fred and I had a well equipped shop where we worked on antique cars. We were among the first to use high detergent oil in Model Ts. The heavy oil people were incensed. Scathing articles appeared in the magazines. It was said that the detergent would foam and dry up the clutch, it would destroy the magneto and not provide enough cushion for the rods. Engines would be ruined! All of this has proved to be nonsense. Multi-grade oils are ideal for Model Ts.
