May Tour to Heidrick Ag Museum in Woodland

Saturday morning, May 18 we met at Raley's to tour back roads to the Heidrick Ag History Museum in Woodland. We toured out of Auburn, through Newcastle to McBean Park in Lincoln. Here we met some more of our members and feasted on donuts. Our group numbered 10 cars plus a couple of modern iron. We left Lincoln, traveling west through rice and sunflower fields, a very flat land area.



We passed through the towns of Trowbridge, Nicolaus and Knights Landing. We arrived in Woodland shortly before noon, stopping at Red

Robin for lunch. The staff at Red Robin were ready for us and had us seated in no time at all. After a belly filling lunch we drove to the Heidrick Museum which was just around the corner. Our docent told us about the history of the Heidrick & Hayes families and the creation of the museum. The museum is divided between tractors and farm equipment on one side and vintage trucks on the other. The exhibits showcase our agricultural and transportation heritage tracing mechanization of the past, and some of the mechanical engineering feats of our forefathers.

While we were relaxing outside a local car owner driving a 1913 Buick, right hand drive touring, stopped by to see our cars. He was with his



family out for an afternoon drive. Our drive home took us along the river, a short burst on I-5 to get over the river and over to Elkhorn. We toured through Rio Linda, North

Our beloved Ron Brown passed away May 8. I am inserting his Obituary.

Ronald Brown, 96, passed peacefully in his home on May 8, 2013. "Mr. Brown," as he was fondly known, taught industrial arts at Placer High School for 30+ years and positively influenced the lives of hundreds of students who continued to show their

appreciation and seek advice throughout the years. Known for his passion in pursuing hobbies, he was active in the restoration and enjoyment of early 20th century antique cars with a specialty in the Ford Model T. In retirement he developed an interest in the preservation of North American Bluebirds and visited numerous grammar school classrooms educating and guiding children in the construction of bird houses. He personally built and distributed more than 5000 bluebird houses in Placer County. An enormously talented and creative individual, he was the "go-to" friend of many. Mr. Brown was predeceased by his son Ronald Brown and daughter Glenna Lancaster.

He is survived by his wife, Eugenia; daughter, Paula; brother, Lowell; and sister, Freda Jones. He leaves behind six grandchildren, 11 great-grandchildren and six great-great-grandchildren.

Friends are welcome to share memories and stories at graveside services on Friday, May 17, 2013 at 10 a.m. at the New Auburn Cemetery followed by a reception at the Canyon View Community Center in Auburn. Donations in Mr. Brown's memory may be made to the North American Bluebird Society.

Bill has made a preliminary plan to layout swap spaces in the asphalt if it comes to that. If we can't use the ball field or the asphalt then we may have to cancel the meet. Signups were passed around for the food booth, pies and the swap meet jobs. Joyce requested approval for \$1500 to purchase the food and supplies for the food booth. Motion by Junette and second by Kenny Marriott. Discussion, lewie thought we had already approved. In the interest of time we voted on it again. Motion passed. Joyce will wait for outcome of the fairground issue before purchasing supplies.

The Star of the Fleet

One day a Model T Touring appeared in the Colonel's junk yard. It had no top and the engine was partly disassembled as if someone was grinding the valves. But, the body and fenders were pretty good and the upholstery not bad. Tires were on all wheels even tho' flat.

Back to negotiating. The Colonel finally agreed to \$2.00 (on flexible payments of course). I suspect the Colonel bought it for a dollar. Maybe it was even given to him for hauling it off or someone just dumped it off there to get rid of it.

Anyway, with Dad's help and direction (and spare parts) we "restored" it. The paint was acceptable factory original. Mechanically the car turned out to be pretty good and most reliable. We drove it mostly at one speed - wide open. It was the summer between my second and third year of high school. Dad said we couldn't drive the car on the road until we had it licensed. We managed to scrape together \$4.00 for a half year license. I'll never forget that day. At last, the open road!!

In the past with our "speedster" we had to drive in our wood lot or barn lot. Every time temptation got the upper hand of our will power, we sneaked the car out on the road. We had to drive right past our neighbor's house. We had a very minor on-going feud with the neighbor boy (older than us) and I think his dad, Joe was a little jealous of Lowell and me because we did a lot of things he wished his son could do - especially in sports. Anyway, he worked the swing shift as a telegrapher at the depot and didn't go to work until 4:00pm. Lowell and I always had to do our misdeeds in the morning when Dad was gone and Joe could see us. He'd trot right down town to report us to the town constable. The constable would come over and complain to Mom who told Dad. You can guess - we had to face the music.

Anyway, the memorable day we got our license, we drove around and around the block Joe's house was in. Sure enough, pretty soon Joe took off down the alley to town. We never learned just what happened but we imagined his disappointment.

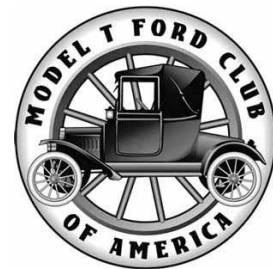
In all fairness, I must admit Joe and all his family were really very fine people and they were always good neighbors.
