My first experience driving a tractor... by John Saylor



It was 1950, I was 7 years old growing up on a farm in the central valley. It was a stormy day, Dad had hay ready for the bailer but the bailer guy had called and would be late. Dad wanted to get some of the hay into the barn before it rained. So, he hitched a 20-foot trailer to an old SC Case tractor and we drove to the field. Dad was to load the hay on the trailer with a pitchfork and I was to drive along as he loaded. I sat in the seat, grabbed the steering wheel and Dad got down to start loading hay when I said "how do I make it move?" Dad showed me how the hand-clutch worked and I was driving along as he loaded the

hay, for all of about 20 minutes when the handle broke on the pitch fork. As we headed back to the yard to fix the pitchfork, the Bailer guy showed up and that was the end of my tractor driving for several years.

Sunshine Report – Susie Krezman reported that she sent a get well card out to Lewis Burcher who fell and broke his wrist recently. Kitty Goodell reported that he was healing up well, but will need some follow up surgery to his hand in the near future. Susie also sent a card to the ailing Dick Johnson.

Secretary Report – Steve Short reported the minutes of the February 2015 General Meeting were printed in last months "T Diggins' Newsletter". As there were no corrections or additions requested, the February minutes were declared to stand as published. Correspondence from other clubs and other miscellaneous items of interest was then passed around the room as Steve made his customary pitch for purchasing Club Coffee Mugs!

He generously offered to keep the Trailer at his home repair shop as the place to have any future work party in preparation for the upcoming Swap Meet.

Gary went on to provide a brief description of how the Swap Meet worked in answer to questions from new Members.

The President made a call for any other New Business from the membership present. Hearing none, he gaveled the Meeting to a close at 7:47 PM.
