As a tour participant with the Mother Lode Model T Club and the Model T Ford Club of America, please use this guide to inspect your car prior touring on a regular basis. Please check each of the following with a "\scrtw" for yes, "N" for no, or and "NA" for not applicable.

And as Erik noted in his message, Check your tires including the spare for splits, cracks and proper pressure.

Any items from the above list that are checked no, should be corrected before driving your T. If you need help making the corrections, please ask a fellow club member for help.
